THE SECRETARY'S NOTEBOOK

Rather than give excerpts of our monthly meeting minuets, I shall report on the main focus of our meetings leading up to the 2009 CoCoFEST!

Those that regularly attend our meetings this past year are President Howard Luckey, Vice Presidents Chris Hawks, Brian Goers and Tony Podraza, Treasurer George Schneeweiss, Secretary Bob Swoger and members John Mark Mobley, Justin Wagner, Frank Pittel and Brian Schubring.

As reported in our Winter 2007 issue, Bob Swoger and Brian Goers noted a submission on coco@maltdmedia.com regarding Glenside IDE Interface owner **Randy Just** reporting that he had recently pulled out his Glenside IDE controller purchased a number of years ago and tried to get it up and running for the first time. Even with all the help people gave him, he was unsuccessful in getting it to work. He was so frustrated that he sold his entire CoCo collection on eBay.

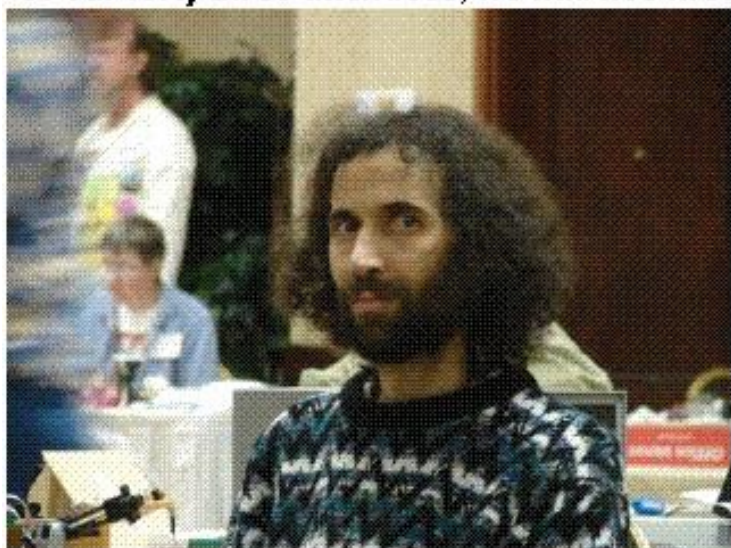
To prove this claim, we asked Chris Hawks to bring the club computer to our next meeting. Brian Goers brought the IDE Interface with its docs and disks. Chris set up the club computer, it worked perfectly. Brian then added the Glenside IDE Interface to the set up. The 5-1/4 disk provided with the interface did not contain all the required software required to make the interface operational. We found that a key piece of software was missing because it is proprietary and we can't distribute it. Also, the manual was put together by our technical types - so the average guy was unable to use it to initially set up his Interface and Hard Drive. Boisy Pitre made an offer to provide a reduced feature version of his software to be sold with our interface. This would have driven the cost of our interface package too high to sell.

Chris Hawks, himself a software developer, undertook the task to make a 35 track single sided 5 1/4 floppy disk which would provide all that would be needed to set up our IDE Interface and format an IDE hard drive, by any non-technical person, with first time success.

At our November 2008 meeting, we set up our system for the 4th month in a row using Brian Goers' Digital Equipment Corporation Dual Disk Drive set which sports two TEAC 30 ms step rate - single sided drives that mimic the very first Radio Shack 35 track drives to assure that the disk would work in any floppy drive out there. We had complete success setting up an IDE hard drive at this meeting. Brian then promised to write a Quick Setup Manual to go with the package.

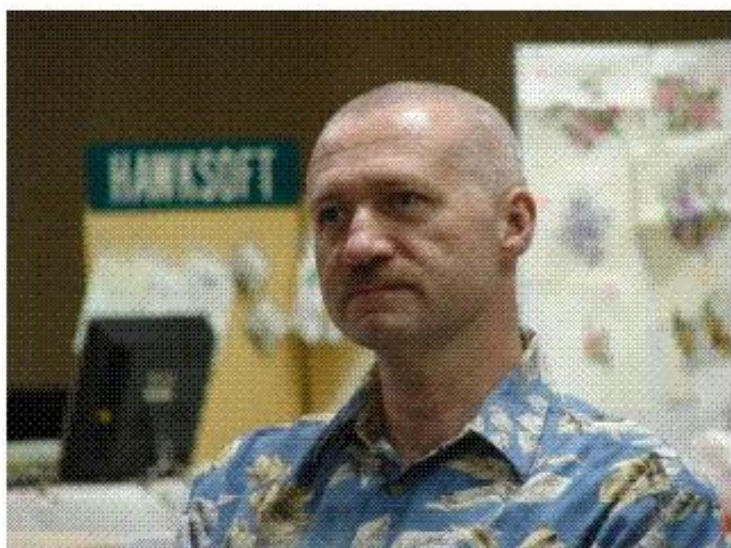

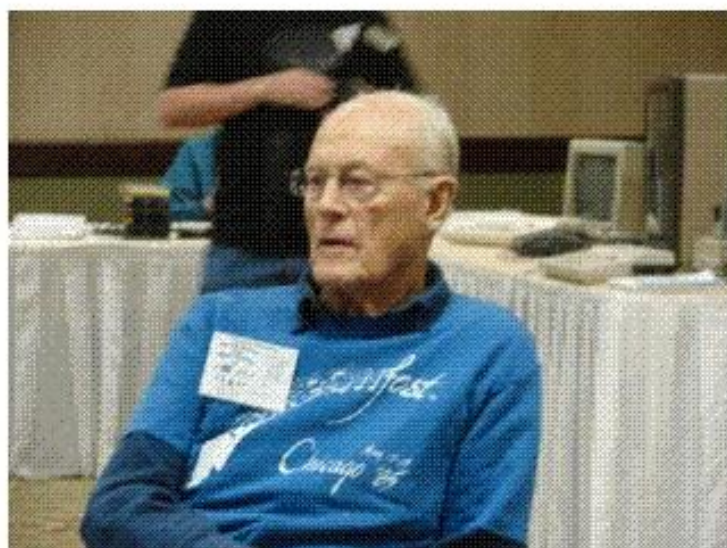

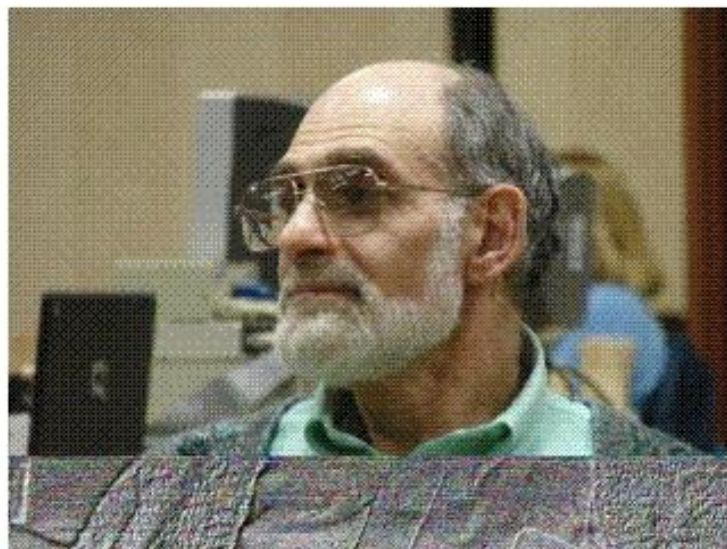

Glenside's CoCoFEST! 2008

Steve Bjork opened the 2008 CoCoFEST! with the announcement of the CoCo 4 Projects with the goal of keeping the Color Computer (CoCo) alive. The CoCo 4 goals are to be completely backwards compatible with all three models of the color computer while using the modern technology to create a next generation CoCo.



The first step is a new version of a CoCo emulator that runs all three versions of the Color Computer. Yes, CoCo emulators have been done in the past, but this one is design for both hardware and software improvements too. First off, you have the option to plug in your old CoCo hardware.

CoCo 4 system will use your old CoCo Joysticks, Game Paks, Keyboards and even Floppy Disk Controllers using an optional I/O control board. This I/O board and Pico size PC motherboard will fit inside an old CoCo 3 case, there by letting you rebuild a CoCo 4 inside a dead CoCo system.

The CoCo 4 emulator also has planed upgrades including enhance graphics and sound to name a just two. Other improvements like SQL database and improved file management will open the door to programming that could never been done on your CoCo.

As you can see, its not just keeping the past alive but opening the door to future to you. These improvements will let you write programs using the capabilities of modern technologies while based on what you already know from your old friend, the CoCo.

The job would begin by scanning their printed materials onto disks. I volunteered for the job and Bob Swoger and his wife Annette delivered material to me on their way to Marion, Illinois, for a Labor Day weekend stay with Annette's sister. I had to meet with them in between my sons martial arts class and transfer a car load of storage tubs from his little rental car into my Explorer. It was quite funny as we did so in the back of a Wal-Mart parking lot like a couple of FBI agents quickly loading up precious documents. I wish I had more time to talk with them but my son was in the middle of belt testing as I met them across the street.

That Christmas my 19 year old brother bought me a super duper nice Cannon all in one scanner/printer/copier. Soon after that I had began scanning my heart out. I do have to say I cheated a little by finding some of the manuals already scanned online. I then started to notice my computer was moving as slow as a slug trying to outrun salt. I then asked Glenside for a flash drive to store the documents onto. They sent me one and it has been a blessing. I now have submitted a list of documents and items that have been scanned.

Remember, the CoCo is of no use at all without software. It is our purpose to try to get a copy of everything that was ever out there for the CoCo - and be able to provide it to CoCo owners. If the software is still under copyright and you are an owner of that software but your tape/disk went bad, it is our purpose to give you a free replacement.

I have also helped with last years T-shirt logo and design. Bob Swoger sent me the basic design and I helped with the lettering. I am glad to help in that area as well. This year we found ourselves in same situation. I helped do the lettering and I believe Bob has finished off the design. (See the last page. Ed.)

Watch our web site and future newsletters for a list of software so far achieved. I want to say thanks to anyone who has helped with this library project. I know Brother Jeremy had worked on the library archive before I got hold of it. I appreciate the condition that the documents were in. I will continue to give updates as they are available. I believe the original idea was to make the CDs with manuals on them and also a DSK image of the program to go along with it. So if anyone has DSK Images of any programs they would like to send me then that would be great. I can start pairing them up with the appropriate manuals. I am happy to be able to help and be of service to The Glenside Color Computer Club.
