

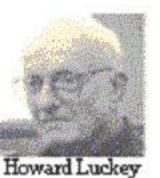

Quiet a few games come with his program. David offers the emulator on a disk for \$5.00 and he gives all of the proceeds to our club. Thanks David.

David Keil asked if anyone had a 6308 processor that he might borrow for the further development of his CoCo emulator. No one present had one to loan.

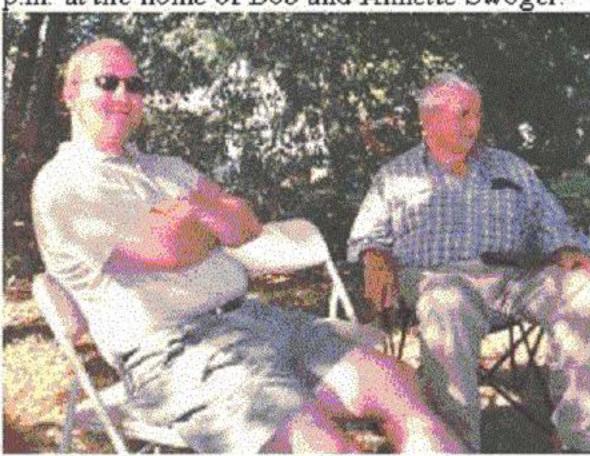
John Chasteen gave us his library card number and 6 filled out forms that we might get our room for the next six months. 21257004953973

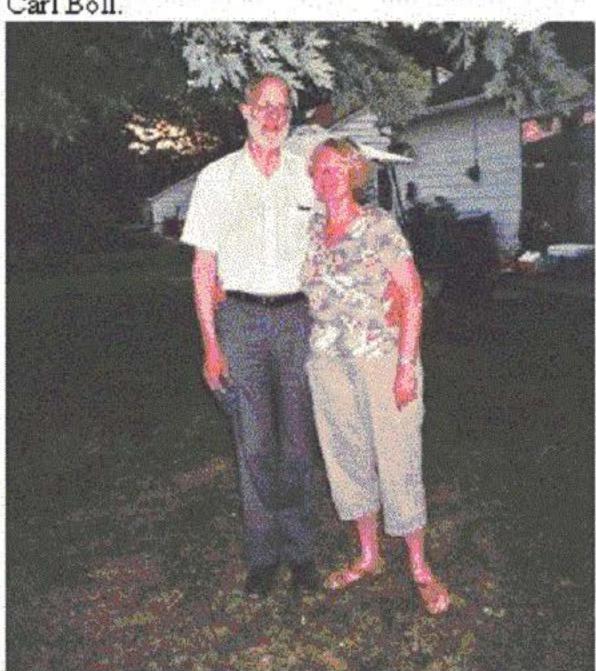
September 12, 2004 GCCC Picnic

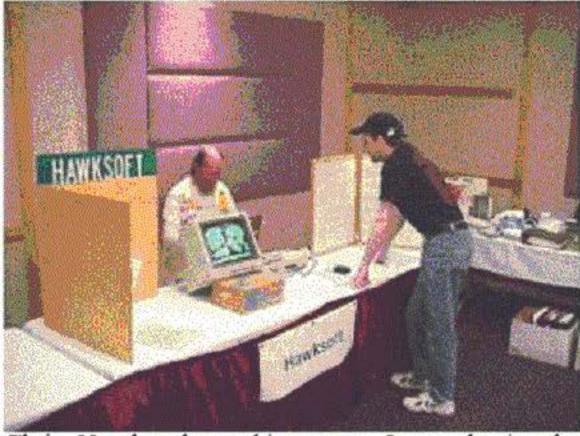

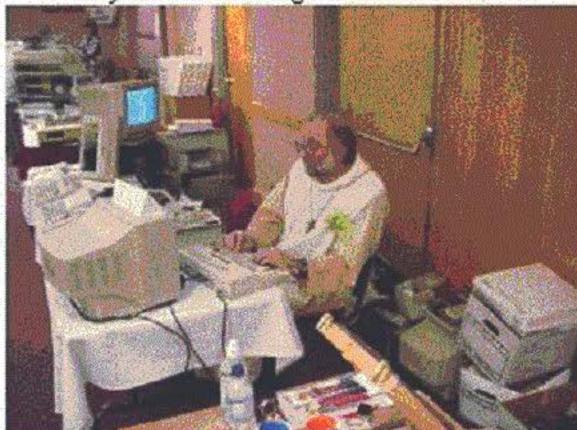

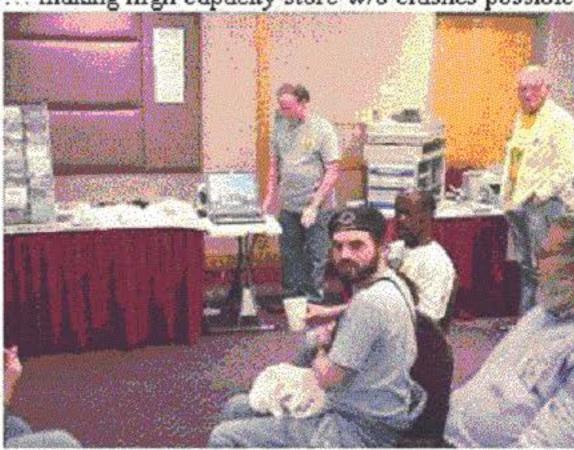

Tony once again this year conducted one of our several no minimum bid auctions.



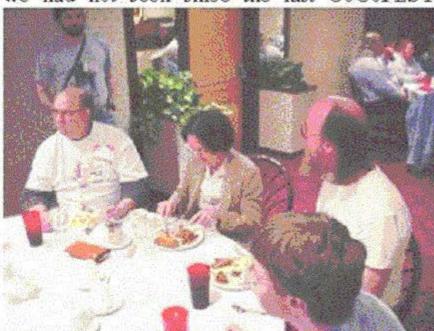


