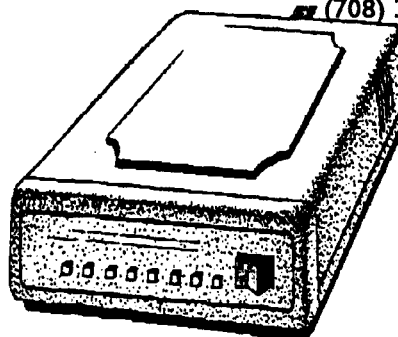

Dear Leonard,

My name is Brian, and as of Jan. '94 I will be the new President of Glenside CoCo Club of IL. Let me welcome you to a new year of Glenside, that should prove to be interesting. As to your Q's, here are some A's.....

Yes. There is a monthly disk, but it is part of what's called 'Disk of the Month. It has an additional cost of \$12.00 per year, plus \$3.00 shipping and handling. However, non-local members can only get them in batches of one year at a time, beginning with the first year. In all, there are four sets of disks. If you would like a particular year's set, you would need to ask for set one, two, three, or four at this time. An index is being assembled and in near-final form, but is not yet fully complete. It should be available by March of 1994.

There is a large collection of things (hardware and software), which are in the process of being fully cataloged, to create a true club library. Please be a little patient.

I personally have not tried to do that, but a few of the others have with some success using WD40, spray ink (brand?). Here is some info that I just got that should help about re-inking...

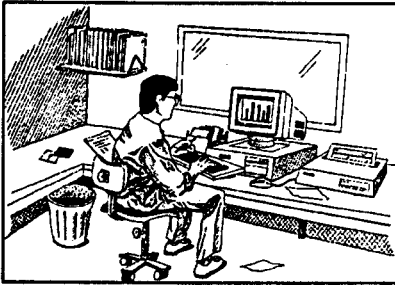

Disk Directory Programs

Here is a program that is not too long, but can be useful to anyone that uses RS-DOS.

I have been working with mainframe computers for a long time and their disks always have identification information both on and in the disk. Why not do the same thing with the disks that we use on the COCO? I wrote DISKNAME to do just this. A twenty byte name can be put in sector 1 of the directory track.

PRINTDIR was written before DISKNAME, but I have expanded and changed it over the years. It is set up for a DMP130 printer, but commented lines will show you where print commands are that have to be changed for other printers. This program will print a directory listing in 1, 2, 3 or 4 columns, based on how many files are saved on the disk. This listing can then be taped onto the disk jacket. 10, 12 or 17 characters to the inch are used depending on how many columns are printed. A listing can also be printed in Microfont for taping onto the disk itself.

I wrote both of these programs while I had a COCO-1 and RS-DOS. Both of them work with the COCO-3 and ADOS-3 and I use them a lot.

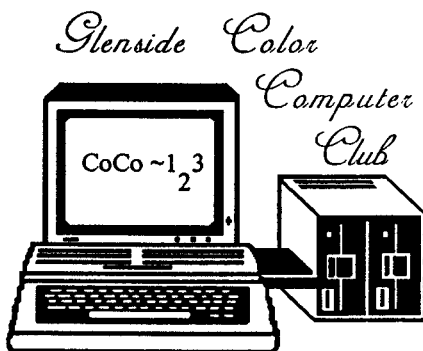
